

We have come to ask for gracious God's blessing on all who go down to the sea in ships and occupy their business on great waters. We also ask a blessing on the Port of Brisbane and its personnel in all their doings, afloat and ashore.

Prayer

Our Father, as we gather here this afternoon to give thanks and praise to you for the beauty of the earth and the mighty waters that surround our land. May we be responsible for the just and proper use of your creation. Like the psalmist of old we cry out to you and pray for the protection of those who go down to the sea in ships and for those who wait for them at home. In your holy Name we pray. **Amen**

Confession:

Our Lord Jesus Christ said: You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. This is the first and great commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

So let us join together in this prayer of general confession.

Merciful God, our maker and our judge, we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed: we have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves; we repent and are sorry for all our sins. Father, forgive us. Strengthen us to love and obey You in newness of life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Almighty God, who has promised forgiveness to all who turn to You in faith, pardon us and set us free from all our sins, strengthen us to do Your will, and keep us in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Before David and Rob bring us our readings let us say this prayer of preparation

Heavenly Father, we thank you for the truth of Your Word. We thank you that we can read and study it without fear of persecution. Please speak to us through it this day. Grant that we will hunger for knowledge and understanding, and trust Your Word for guidance to live for you each day. Amen

First Reading: Read by Davis *Beckinsale* from 2 Timothy Chapter 2 beginning at the first verse.

You then, my child, be strengthened by the grace that is in Christ Jesus, and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also. Share in suffering as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No soldier gets entangled in civilian pursuits, since his aim is to please the one who enlisted him. An athlete is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules. It is the hard-working farmer who ought to have the first share of the crops. Think over what I say, for the Lord will give you understanding in everything.

Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, the offspring of David, as preached in my gospel, for which I am suffering, bound with chains as a criminal. But the word of God is not bound! Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory. The saying is trustworthy, for:

If we have died with him, we will also live with him;

if we endure, we will also reign with him;

if we deny him, he also will deny us;

if we are faithless, he remains faithful—

for he cannot deny himself.

A Worker Approved by God

Remind them of these things, and charge them before God not to quarrel about words, which does no good, but only ruins the hearers. Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth. But avoid irreverent babble, for it will lead people into

The Sailors Psalm 107 vs 23 – 32 David Beckinsale

Some went down to the sea in ships, doing their trade on great waters; these men have seen the works of God and His wonders in the deep For He commanded and raised the stormy wind,

which lifted up the waves of the sea.

They mounted up to heaven, they went down into the depths;

their courage melted away in their calamity;

they reeled and staggered like drunken men,

and were at their wits end.

Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble,

and He delivered them from their distress:

He made the storm be still, and the waves of the sea were hushed.

Then they were glad because they had quiet,

and He brought them to their desired haven.

Let them thank the Lord for His goodness:

and for the wonders He does for the children of men;

Let them exalt Him in the assembly of the people: and praise Him in the council of elders.

The Third Reading: Read by Rob Clark from Acts Chapter 27 verses 1-2 and verses 37-44.

And when it was decided that we should sail for Italy, they delivered Paul and some other prisoners to a centurion of the Augustan Cohort named Julius. And embarking in a ship of Adramyttium, which was about to sail to the ports along the coast of Asia, we put to sea, accompanied by Aristarchus, a Macedonian from Thessalonica.

(We were in all 276 persons in the ship.) And when they had eaten enough, they lightened the ship, throwing out the wheat into the sea.

Now when it was day, they did not recognize the land, but they noticed a bay with a beach, on which they planned if possible to run the ship ashore. So they cast off the anchors and left them in the sea, at the same time loosening the ropes that tied the rudders. Then hoisting the foresail to the wind they made for the beach. But striking a reef, they ran the vessel aground. The bow stuck and remained immovable, and the stern was being broken up by the surf. The soldiers' plan was to kill the prisoners, lest any should swim away and escape. But the centurion, wishing to save Paul, kept them from carrying out their plan. He ordered those who could swim to jump overboard first and make for the land, and the rest on planks or on pieces of the ship. And so it was that all were brought safely to land.

Lord God, in whose image and likeness we are made, we bless your name for all who care for seafarers. We thank you for those who established this work and pray for all who support it now. Give them and us the strength to persevere and not to rest until we have done your will in joy and faithfulness. Lord, in your mercy **hear our prayer.**

Almighty and ever-loving God, ruler of all things in heaven and earth, hear our prayers for this our Mission. Strengthen the faithful, arouse the careless, and restore the penitent. We look to you to provide all things necessary to maintain this Mission into the future.
